Property Tax Statements

Property tax statements for Steinbach have been mailed and are due September 29, 2023. Tax statements are mailed to the current owners at time of printing. It is the property owners' responsibility to obtain a copy should they have recently purchased a property and not received a tax statement. If you are expecting a tax statement and have not yet received a copy or if your mailing address has changed recently, please contact City Hall at 204-326-9877 or e-mail taxes@steinbach.ca.

How to Pay Your Taxes

Recommended: TIPP Program

The <u>Tax Installment Payment Plan</u> allows taxpayers to have payments automatically withdrawn on the first business day of each month, or to pre-authorize a single annual payment, equal to the balance due on your property tax statement, on tax due date in September.



Online banking. The City of Steinbach is registered as an electronic banking payee with Credit Union, Royal Bank, CIBC, TD Canada Trust, BMO and Scotiabank. Please be aware of your financial institution's processing time to ensure your online payment is received by the due date.



<u>By mail</u>. Along with the bottom portion of the tax bill, cheques can be made payable to the City of Steinbach and mailed to the address above. Please ensure payments are received at City Hall on or before the due date.



In person. Bring your tax bill and payment to City Hall (see address above) between 8am and 4pm, Monday to Friday. Credit cards are not accepted. If paying by debit, please ensure you have set up the necessary limit with your bank.



24 Hour Drop Off. Along with the bottom portion of the tax bill, payment can be submitted via the drop box located at the Administration entrance of City Hall, facing Reimer Avenue. It is not advised to put cash in the drop box.

Residents' Role in Water & **Sewer System Management**



Residents should not discharge sump pumps into the City's sewer system, private holding or sewage tanks, floor drains, branch or sanitary

building drains, or on city property including streets, gutters, and ditches. Improper discharge causes strain on city storm water and sewer systems that are not intended to take on this additional water. Residents are encouraged to properly discharge their sump pumps (By-Law 1674) outside of their home and onto a concrete splash pad to direct water away from the house foundation. Homeowners should take note that water backup and/or flooding that occurs with a properly functioning backwater valve indicates water is coming from the property itself. Common sources include improper sump pump discharge, improper lot grading or slope, or water usage within the home (once a backwater valve closes, there is limited water storage within your plumbing system). Homeowners are encouraged to proactively protect their property as well as regularly maintain their backwater valve as advised by the manufacturer.

Dandelions, Living with a **Noxious Weed**



To some this plant is a welcome sight, used to provide that first food for our bees, to make salads and wines, among other uses. To others however, it is

a nuisance and property owners will work diligently to keep their yards free of this seemingly invasive plant. Although we may have different views of the Dandelion it is a noxious weed under the City of Steinbach By-Law 1663.
